October Trip Report

Storm Mountain

On this trip, all week the weather prognosticators had been predicting that we would have to contend with snow and lots of wind for the trip. Well they missed the snow part, we didn't have any, but they got the wind part right. It kind of reminds you that an ill wind can be contagious. We had twenty one vehicles leave the parking lot at the appointed time and along the way at Masonville we added another four to our group. A couple of miles out of Masonville, we turned off onto the Storm Mountain Road. The first mile of this road is through private property and is only open during hunting season. As soon as we got to the Forest Service gate, we stopped to air down.

The wind was whipping as we started up the trail. Every

We weren't a couple of miles into the trip when someone call on the CB and suggested that we stop and gather the group together again as they hadn't seen the person behind them for a while and couldn't get anyone behind them

on the CB. So we stopped and waited and then waited some more. Tim finally called our tail gunner, John, on the ham radio. John said that a tree had blown down across the road blocking their way and that they would have to cut the tree out of the way with a hand bow saw. While we were stopped and waited for them to rejoin the rest of us, we noticed a strange man made structure about 50 yards off the trail to the west. Nobody had seen anything like it and we couldn't even venture a guess as to what it was. Someone went over to take a look and came back and described it to the rest of us. 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


