Cherokee Park and Around

We had ten rigs show up at the King Soopers parking lot for our trip on a beautiful Sunday morning. When this trip was planned, the weather prognosticators had predicted snow for the day before the trip. Well, they were wrong. We didn't even have a hint of snow even at

the higher elevations but the trip must go on. After a short drivers meeting, we left our meeting place and headed north on highway 287 and the first stop was at the beginning of the Cherokee Park Road (8oC) to air down. Darren and his passenger Ben C. were waiting there for us.



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On up the Cherokee Park road we made a quick stop at a potty box before turning off onto the Prairie Divide Road. We saw a little bit of snow beside the road every once in a while and that turned out to be about the only snow we would see on the day. We made such good time that we decided to visit Lost Lake. Several got out of their vehicles to stretch their legs and walked down to the lake. We then went back to the Creedmore Lakes road and then turned onto the Chicken Park Road. Along the way we saw our first remnants of some spot fires. We found a clearing and pulled off the road to have our lunch break. Chicken Park is an easy road meandering through the pine tree forest with a clearing every once in a while. It eventually ends up back onto the Creedmore Lakes road headed towards Red Feather Lakes.

Darren noticed on his mapping program that there was a road called Many Thunders that would take us back down to the Prairie Divide road. We made the turn onto Many Thunders which was very steep coming down from the top.

We noticed that this road is a natural drainage for the area. The fire fighters had scraped off all the vegetation twenty or thirty feet on either side of the road for a fire break the whole length of the



road. Thank goodness that the Cameron Peak fire never got to this area. As soon as we reached the Prairie Divide road, someone called on the CB about a majestic moose in the brush near the road. Pictures were taken and then we drove a couple of miles into Red Feather Lakes.

After a short detour to see Elf Lane, Gnome Road in Red Feather, our caravan went down the Manhattan

Road. It didn't take too long before we saw the fire damage. It was a little strange to see the trees for ten to fifteen feet on either side of the road were green. Everything beyond the green trees was total devastation. It was amazing to see that the firefighters had saved all the houses in the Cunningham Corners area as well as all the houses on the Pingree Hill road down to Rustic. In some cases the fire burned to the back of the house but the house its self was saved. We saw a lot of equipment up there being used for repair and rehabilitation. Kudos to our intrepid firefighters for the fantastic job they did. The last stop of the day was at the 7 Mile trailhead to air up our tires.

We covered a lot of territory on this day, 100 miles round trip to be exact and it was a fun day for the Mountaineer family. Even though we didn't get to do any real 4-wheeling on the day, we got to explore some roads that we had never been on before.
