Old Flowers Road Trip

During the drivers meeting trip leader Craig passed out a biography about the man who had built the road that we would be wheeling on this day. Promptly at 9:00 we headed out and drove through Laporte and Bellvue. While going through Bellvue, it was pointed out that Jacob Flowers had founded the town of Bellvue. We saw the two prominent structures that he built and still stand today, the mercantile/post office building and his red stone house.

At the trailhead we stopped to air down and stretch a little bit. What we would drive on this day is just a short

He was commissioned to build the road by Fort Collins business men so that they could ship supplies to the booming mining towns of Teller City and Lulu in North Park. The first part of the road was lush and green and had not been touched by the Cameron Peak fire. When we got to a beautiful green meadow, we stopped to get out and poke around for a while at an old falling down cabin. It is rumored that this old cabin is tied to a nearby green quartz mine.

On up the road we got into the burnt-up part of the forest. First there was the High Park fire in 2012 and then the more recent Cameron Peak fire. We noticed that the trees are already growing back fast. In places the pine trees are so thick that they are touching each and are already 2 to 3 feet tall. The aspens are also coming back and are 5 to 6 feet tall. After reaching the west end of the trail, we headed up to the Fish Creek Picnic area on the Pingree Park road for a lunch stop. This picnic area hadn't burned and to the relief to all, the restrooms were unlocked. We filled the picnic tables and had a good time getting to know each other. It was pointed out that almost half of the 4WD vehicles on this trip we driven by ladies. The picnic ended when (It's almost a Mountaineer tradition now) Sandy Maresh passed out her homemade cookies for desert.

We went up Pingree Hill until we reached County Road 44H, the Pennock Pass Road. Pennock Pass was named for Charles E. Pennock who owned a nursery and seed company in Fort Collins and was married to Jacob Flowers daughter Lydia. The first mile or so was still green forest but once we got to the switchbacks the scenery changed to the scared remnants of the Cameron Fire. The scenery did not change until we got about a
